Optional deeper dives (all publicly available information)

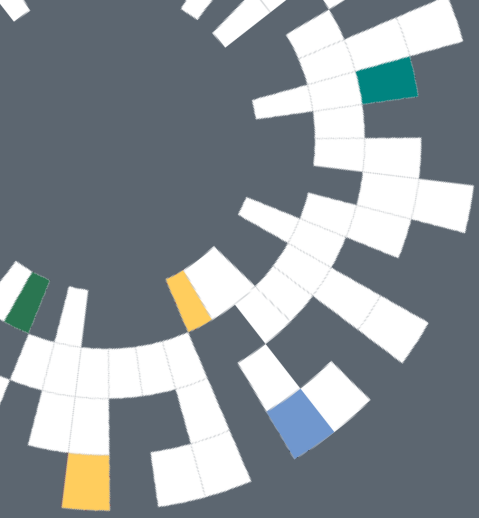
# Equitable and Inclusivity Goals

# Profiles Overview

# Purpose

The profiles provide an overview of localized data by Health Statistics Regions (HSR) to community members and individuals working around substance misuse prevention and treatment. These profiles are intended as a resource for understanding substance use trends that can be used to inform local initiatives, programs, policies, and other activities.

# Development/Process

In 2021, evaluators conducted a needs assessment on behalf of the SEOW to understand current data use among substance use professionals, capacity to access and analyze data, and how data were used in decision making. Additionally, evaluators collected information around how data was used to support health equity and how people engaged with the SEOW. Results from the assessment identified two primary data use needs that resulted in the following recommendations:

1. Provide timely, localized, county-level data with a focus on opioids, prescription drugs, and stimulants.
2. Provide data with a focus on smaller geographies, demographics, and using multiple data sets.

# Insights from Other SEOWs Interviews



## Lessons learned from Out-of-State SEOWs

### Accessibility Challenges:

- Finding: Interactive dashboards (e.g., Tableau) were complex and less user-friendly
- Action: Adopted Infogram for improved accessibility and ease of use.

### Frameworks:

- Finding: Common use of risk and protective factors framework
- Action: Integrated the risk and protective framework into Colorado's regional profiles.

### Data Walk-Throughs:

- Finding: SEOWs conducted data walk-throughs for feedback on drafts.
- Action: Implemented data walk-throughs with local professionals in Colorado.

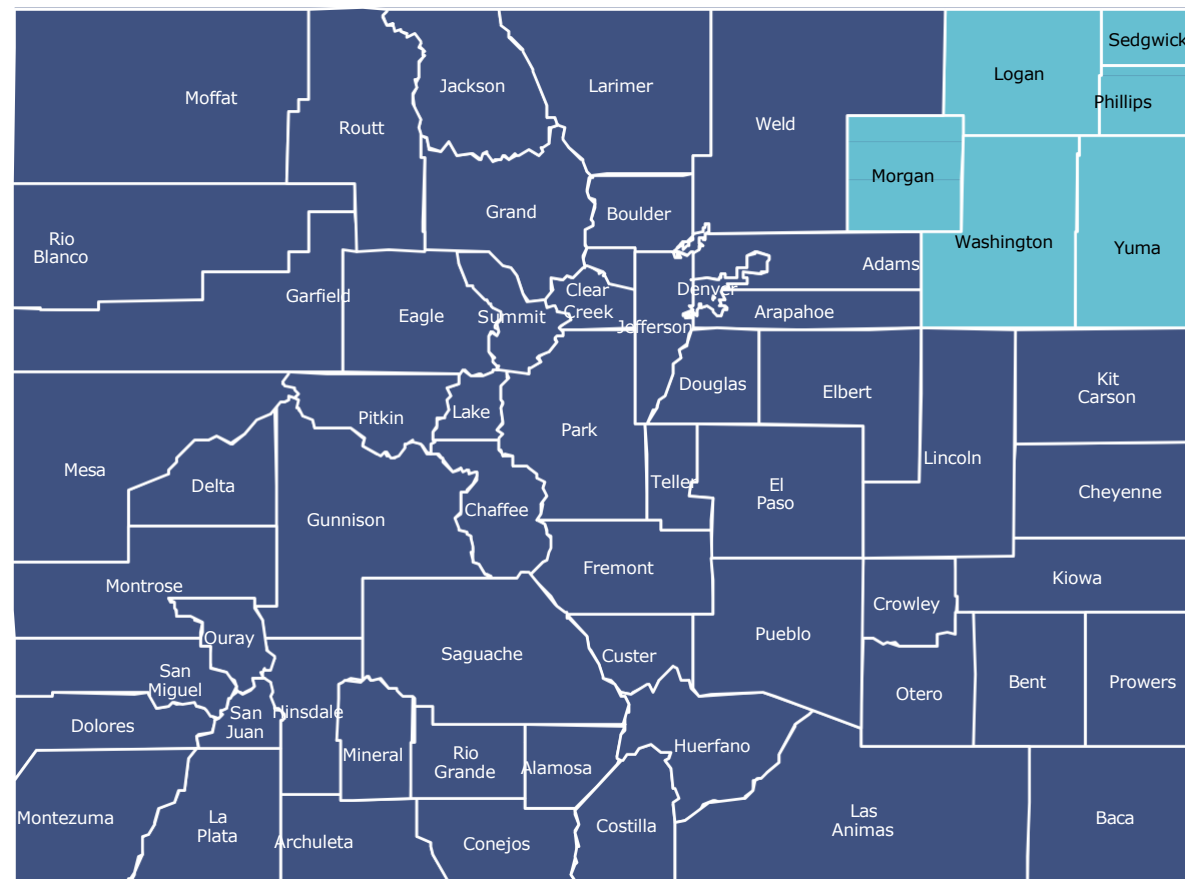

## Positive Feedback

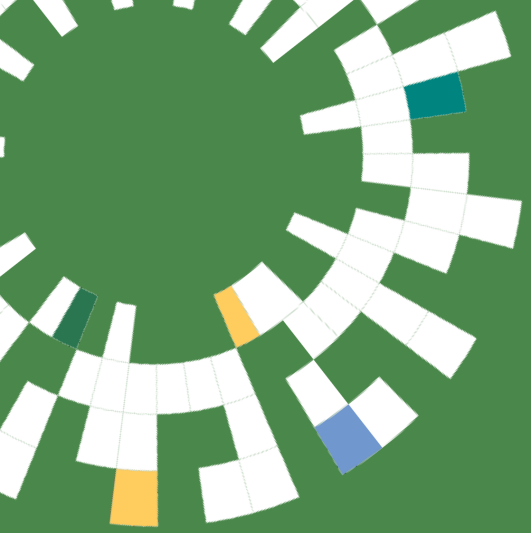
- Usefulness: Data supports grant writing and prevention efforts.
