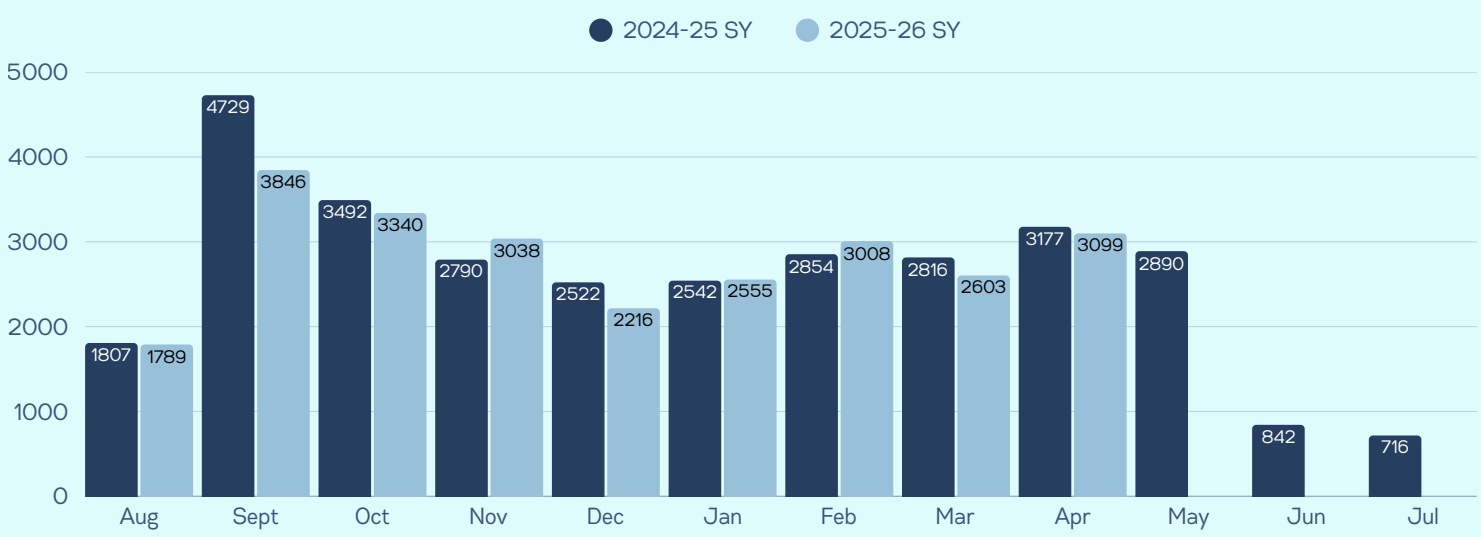

3,099 reports were received in April 2026, and 25,502 reports were received to date for the current school year.

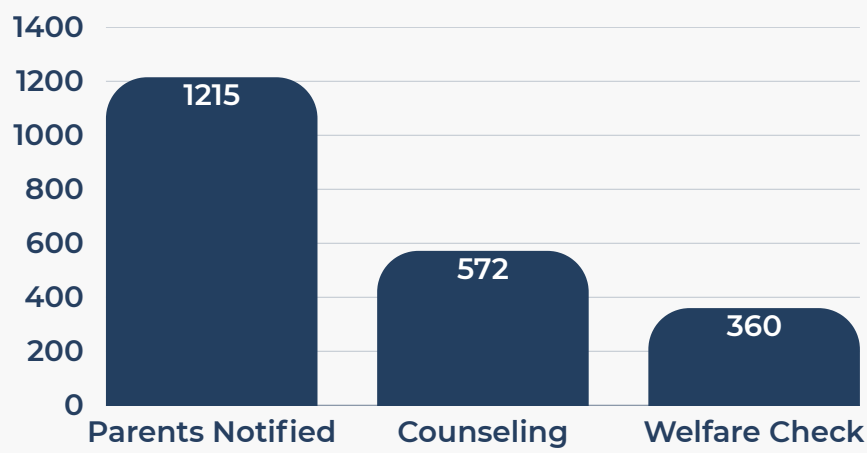

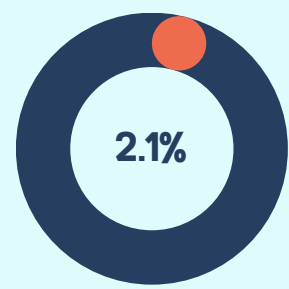

Report Example

A report indicated a student was struggling with relationship issues, self-harming, and feeling depressed. Law enforcement completed a welfare check, and the school notified the parents. The parents are now working with the school social worker on a safety plan and have been offered additional resources.

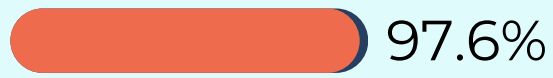


Duplicate Reports this SY



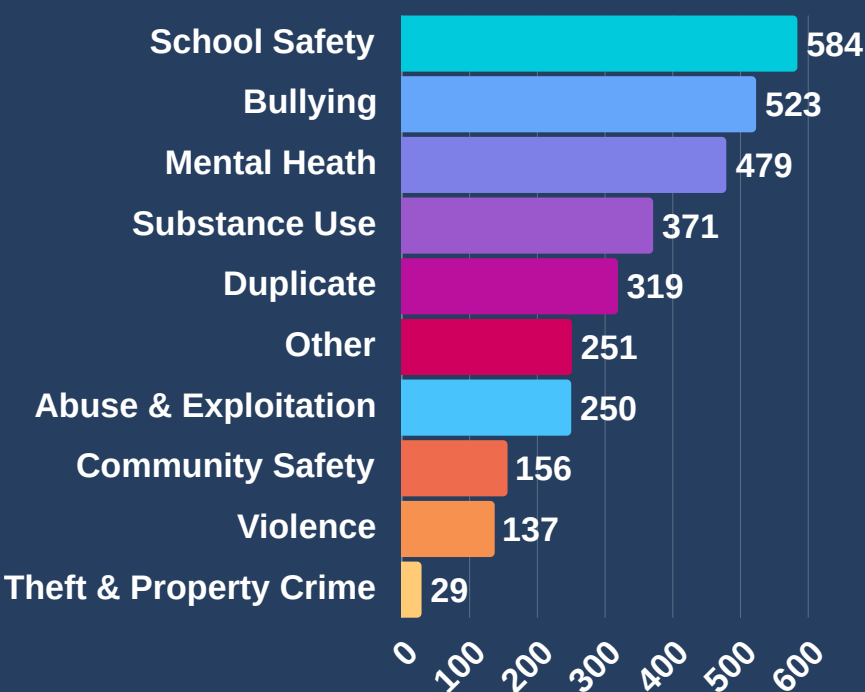
3,950 duplicate reports have been reported during the current school year.

97.6% of reports received during the 25-26 school year, which began 8/1/25, were determined to be valid. Misuse reports were 0.6%, and false reports were 1.8%

April Reporting Themes



Report Example

A person reported that a student was using a social media account to catfish peers into sending explicit photos. School teams investigated, spoke with those involved, and confirmed the behavior occurred. The student's parents were notified, and school disciplinary action was taken.
