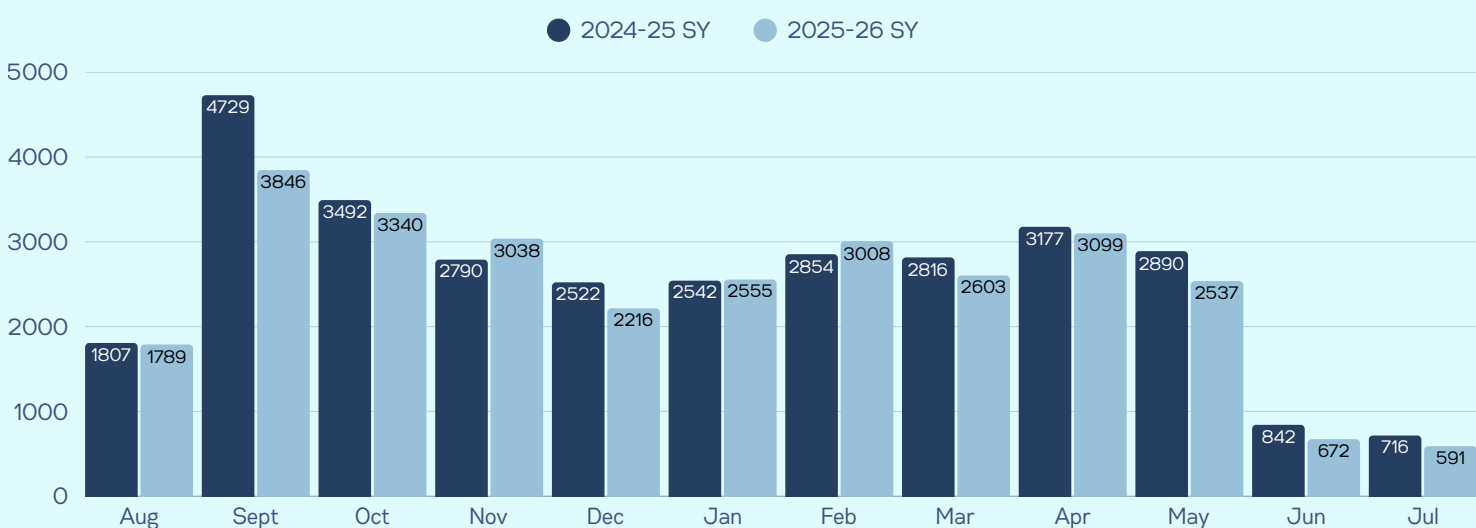

and 29,302 reports were received to date for the current school year.

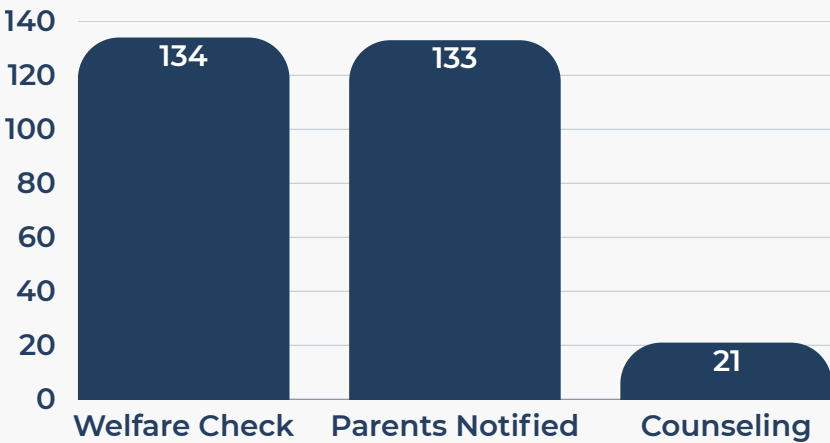

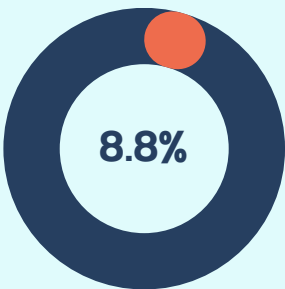

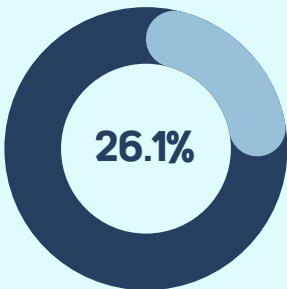

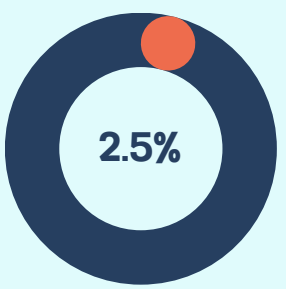

Report Example

A person reported that a student was experiencing suicidal ideations, self-harming, dealing with mental health issues, and using substances. Local law enforcement conducted a welfare check, contacted the student’s parents, and spoke with the student, who stated they had thoughts of self-harm but were not planning to act on them. A suicide assessment was completed, and law enforcement met with the parents to create a safety plan.

Duplicate Reports this SY



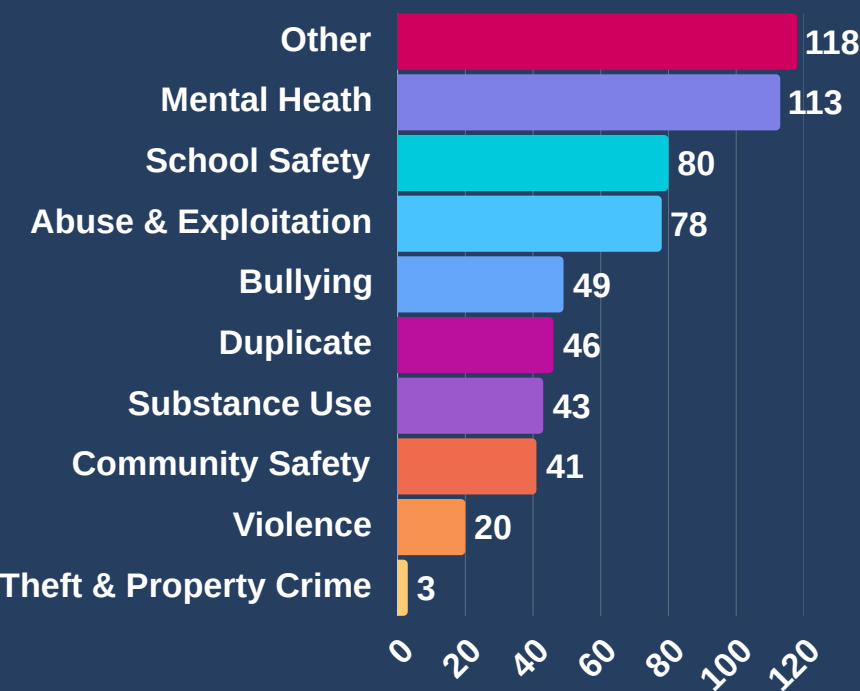
4,282 duplicate reports have been reported during the current school year.

Valid reports during this SY



97.6% of reports received during the 25-26 school year, which began 8/1/25, were determined to be valid. Misuse reports were 0.6%, and false reports were 1.8%

July Reporting Themes



Report Example

A person reported that a student was harassing another student through text messages, and that after being blocked, they began sharing the other student’s number with peers. An officer contacted the reported student’s parent, who confirmed their child had sent text messages but had not shared the other student’s number. The parent had their child block the other student and will notify school teams if any further issues arise.
