SUBJECT: Community Benefit Contributions

You asked us to provide a summary of community benefit contributions that were made by Rocky Mountain Health Maintenance Organization, Incorporated (RMHMO) for the three or four years prior to 2016. Below are the amounts of the community benefit contributions that have been made by RMHMO to various non-profit organizations or governmental entities in the community from 2012-2015. The contributions were made to entities such as Hilltop Community Resources, Quality Health Network, Marillac Clinic, Colorado Mesa University, HopeWest, Strive, Delta County Economic Development, and Grand Junction Economic Partnership. These contributions were made to promote various community benefit purposes such as hospice care, pre-natal programs, nurse training programs, economic development, health information exchange, and indigent dental care.

2012 - \$279,153.23
2013 - \$824,254.69
2014 - \$776,133.77
2015 - \$519,131.25

In addition to these community benefit contributions being made by RMHMO, RMHMO provided funding for a program to assist with physician recruiting in Mesa County. The program essentially ended in 2015. The program involved payments being made to new physicians to assist with student loan debt and to assist providers by financially supporting efforts aimed at recruiting new physicians to Mesa County. During 2012-2015, the amounts paid by RMHMO for these physician recruiting efforts were as follows:

2012 - \$ 339,584.00
2013 - \$ 213,750.00
2014 - \$ 109,826.83
2015 - \$ 58,868.32
